There are 2 indicators mentioned on the website <https://delta87.org/dashboards/poland/>, which we analysed: vulnerable employment (16.3%) in 2018 and unemployment (15.5) in 2014. According to the ILO methodology the indicator Vulnerable employment is a percentage share of self-employed persons (without employees) and contributing family workers in a total number of employed persons.

These data are in compliance with figures taken from Eurostat's website (on the basis of the LFS), except for years 2018 and 2019. The indicator Vulnerable employment on a main Delta 8.7 website is 16.3% (2018), while on UNDP/HDR website is 16.2% (2018) and 16.1% (2019). The indicator calculated on the basis of data from Eurostat's database in 2019 was 16.0%. The differences in 2018 and 2019 are of 0.1 percentage point, but a footnote below the indicator in a table UNDP/HDR states that estimates are modelled by the International Labour Organization.

As regards the indicator "unemployment (15.5) in 2014" presented under Social Protection Coverage we explain that no data source is provided for this indicator. However, we calculated values for the indicator defined by ILO as "Percentage share of unemployed persons obtaining benefit in a total number of registered unemployed persons". Our calculations for 2014 do not correspond to the value presented on the website, but we obtained this value from our calculations for 2019, so this might be a mistake. Please find below data calculated by us for Poland for the period 2014-2019 (as of 31 December in a given year):

2014 – 12.6%
2015 – 13.1%
2016 – 13.2%
2017 – 14.5%
2018 – 14.6%
2019 – 15.5%

Accidents at work survey applies only to people over 16 years of age. When it comes to the indicator Rates of Fatal Occupational Injuries and Rates of Non-fatal Occupational Injuries (Source ILO) – we want to emphasize that the source of this indicator is unknown. Referring to the SDG Goal 8.8.1, presented on the Statistics Poland website, the indicator is related to the number of injured in accidents at work for 1000 working in the period 2010-2014 (in total and injured in fatal accidents).
